Enhancement and Depletion modes of transistor action, MOS and CMOS Fabrication process, BiCMOS Technology, Comparison between CMOS and Bipolar technologies. Id versus Vds Relationships, Aspects of MOS transistor Threshold Voltage, MOS transistor Trans-conductance and Output Conductance, MOS transistor Figure of Merit, The Pass transistor. The nMOS Inverter, The CMOS Inverter, Latch-up.

UNIT II

Layout diagrams: Layout Design rules, Layout Diagrams of CMOS inverter and different logic functions.

Basic Circuit Concepts: Sheet Resistance, Sheet Resistance concept applied to MOS transistors and Inverters, Area Capacitance of Layers, Standard unit of capacitance, Some area Capacitance Calculations, The Delay Unit Inverter Delays, Driving large capacitive loads, Propagation Delays, Wiring Capacitances, Fan-in and fan-out characteristics, Realization of gates using nMOS, pMOS and CMOS technologies.

Scaling models and scaling factors, Scaling factors for device parameters, Limitations of scaling, Limits due to sub threshold currents, Limits on logic levels and supply voltage due to noise, Limits due to current density, Introduction to Switch Logic and Gate Logic.
