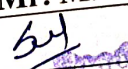

Brief Report on the Event	On August 22, 2025, Dr. Ch. Padmanabha Raju, the chairperson of PVPSIT's discipline committee and anti-ragging led an enlightening orientation session for first-year students. The necessity of discipline, moral behaviour, and following institutional policies and procedures were underlined during the workshop. Dr. Raju emphasized ethics and personal accountability as the cornerstones of a courteous and upbeat learning environment. He restated PVPSIT's zero-tolerance anti-ragging policy, outlining protected reporting avenues, retaliatory protection, and clear penalties. In order to maintain a courteous and safe campus, he also emphasized the importance of guardian involvement, pledge drives, on-going awareness campaigns, and senior-junior mentoring. Students were encouraged to contribute to a peaceful and orderly campus life by learning about the anticipated norms of behaviour at PVPSIT and the repercussions of infractions during this orientation. Students were able to get their questions answered throughout the interactive session, which reinforced the ideals that are crucial to their success and general development.

Name of the Activity / Program: Disciplinary & Anti ragging committee Orientation

About the Topic/ Activity:

As part of the orientation for first-year B. Tech. students, an essential interaction session was organized with the Disciplinary Committee and the Anti-Ragging Committee. **Dr. Raju**, Chairperson of both the Disciplinary Committee and the Anti-Ragging Committee. He provided a cohesive view of institutional standards and support systems. The session covered the responsibilities and procedures of both bodies, highlighting their shared goal of maintaining a harmonious and value-driven campus life.

Purpose of the Session

The primary objective was to ensure students understand the non-negotiable standards of conduct and the availability of institutional support:

- To familiarize students with the Code of Conduct, disciplinary procedures, and the Zero-Tolerance Anti-Ragging Policy.
- To clarify student rights and responsibilities during any formal proceedings.
- To emphasize the importance of maintaining a respectful, positive, and safe learning environment for all.
- To encourage proactive engagement with academic advisors and student support services.

Key Highlights: Discipline and Anti-Ragging

Dr. Padmanabha Raju presented a unified message on upholding campus standards, focusing on two critical areas:

1. Upholding Discipline and Integrity

- **Committee Structure:** Dr. Raju explained the composition of the Disciplinary Committee, which includes senior faculty and administration, ensuring fair, unbiased, and confidential proceedings.
- **Breaches and Consequences:** Students were briefed on common violations (e.g., examination misconduct, vandalism) and the structured disciplinary process, noting that consequences can range from formal warnings to suspension.
- **Educational vs. Punitive:** It was stressed that the process is fundamentally educational, guiding students toward responsible decision-making and professional maturity, not just punishment.

- **Academic Honesty:** Academic integrity specifically avoiding plagiarism, cheating, and data fabrication was highlighted as a non-negotiable standard for B.Tech. students.

2. Zero-Tolerance Anti-Ragging Mandate

- **Legal & Institutional Stance:** Dr. Raju emphasized that ragging is a criminal offense under law, and the institution enforces a Zero-Tolerance Policy.
- **Definition of Ragging:** Ragging was clearly defined as any act of physical or psychological abuse, aggressive behaviour, or public humiliation directed at junior students.
- **Immediate Expulsion:** Students were firmly informed that involvement in ragging, in any capacity, will result in immediate expulsion from the institution and referral to legal authorities.

The interaction successfully established a serious yet informative atmosphere, leading to positive outcomes:

- **Clarity on Policies:** Students gained a complete understanding of the Code of Conduct and the severity of the Anti-Ragging Policy.
- **Confidence and Proactivity:** Students developed confidence in knowing their rights and the proper channels to address challenges responsibly.
- **Safe Environment Assurance:** The detailed coverage of the anti-ragging measures ensured first-year students felt secure and aware of the institutional commitment to their safety.

In conclusion, the session effectively reinforced the importance of discipline, integrity, and safety, better preparing the students to become responsible members of the institution's community.
